Bursary Regulations

Focus

Servicemen or the children of discharged servicemen

Level of Study

Undergraduate and Postgraduate

Background

These bursaries are provided from a Trust Fund established by the Will of the late Ella Grace Elgar who, with her husband Charles, farmed at "Fernside" near Featherston in the Wairarapa.

Value and Tenure

The value of each bursary shall be up to \$750.

The bursary is tenable for one year.

Typical Number on Offer

Typically, up to three bursaries per academic year

Eligibility

Applicants must be discharged servicemen or the children of discharged servicemen. Preference will be given to applicants studying agriculture

Selection Criteria

The selection criterion is academic merit.

Selection Panel

The bursary is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Trustees of the Bursary.

Conditions of the Bursary

Recipients may re-apply in subsequent years.
