Focus

Agriculture and Horticulture

Level of Study

Postgraduate

Purpose

The William Hudson Scholarship supports postgraduate agricultural and horticultural students.

Background

This scholarship was established under the terms of the will of H. W. Hudson, of Auckland, in appreciation of the advantages his son, William, gained from being trained in agriculture.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital.

The scholarship is offered annually as funds permit and the tenure is for a single academic year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship is typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- graduates of Massey University
- enrolled full time for a postgraduate degree or a postgraduate diploma in Applied Academic Programme disciplines relevant to agriculture or horticulture (paper prefix of 111, 112, 117, 119, 138, 171, 188, 189, 238, 239, 283, 284 and 285) at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on:

- academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship

The University Scholarships Committee may take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants in seeking an equitable distribution of funds.

Selection Panel

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The University Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and its decision is final.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
