Scholarship Regulations

Level of Study

Postgraduate

Purpose

The Sir Alan Stewart Postgraduate Scholarships encourage new postgraduate enrolments from other New Zealand tertiary institutions and to assist Massey University students to progress from undergraduate to postgraduate study.

Background

Sir Alan Stewart was the first Vice-Chancellor of Massey University.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is \$4000 for full-time students and pro-rated for part-time students for a single academic year, to be paid in two equal instalments.

Typical Number on Offer

Up to 40 awards may be awarded each year, contingent on funds available.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be enrolled or be intending to enrol full-time or part-time, in the year the award is to be made, in their initial year of a first postgraduate programme, undertaken either internally or via distance
- have completed an undergraduate degree at a New Zealand university

Selection Criteria

Academic merit in the undergraduate degree. Consideration will normally only be given to students with a B+ GPA average or better.

Selection Panel

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee.

The Committee has the right to refrain from making the award if there are no suitable applicants.

Conditions of the Scholarship

Students who have completed a postgraduate programme at any university are not eligible.

Part-time students must be enrolled in no less than 30 credits in both Semesters One and Two to be eligible for this award.

Part-time students may re-apply for a second-year tenure. No guarantee will be given of a second award.

Students enrolling in 90 credit or greater research courses are not eligible to apply but may be eligible for other scholarships.
