

College of Creative Arts – Toi Rauwhārangī Tahua Āwhina Promising Student Bursary Bursary Regulations

Focus

Creative Arts

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The Tahua Āwhina bursary will support talented and creative students who may be facing challenges or circumstances that may hinder them from progressing in their studies.

Background

Funded by donations from alumni, staff and other college supporters, these bursaries are part of the revitalization of the existing College of Creative Arts Development Fund, providing a focused option for donations to be used to support students studying towards an undergraduate creative arts degree at the College of Creative Arts, Massey University.

Value and Tenure

The value of an award will be up to \$5,000 per annum towards the recipient's fee account. The tenure is one year.

Typical Number on Offer

The number of awards offered each year vary depending on the available funding.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- enrolled full time in an undergraduate programme within the College of Creative Arts
- entering the second or third year of study

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on demonstrated ability and commitment to the applicant's field of study.

Need will also be taken into consideration, with candidates identifying needs that would likely hinder or prevent them from continuing their studies.

Selection Panel

The bursary is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of a selection panel comprising of faculty in the College of Creative Arts, across representative subject fields. The panel will ensure that the allocation of bursaries are equitably distributed across college subject areas over time, as well as across diverse student demographics.

Conditions of the Bursary

This scholarship may be held concurrently with any other scholarship or award provided this is not considered to constitute a conflict of interest.

Payment will be made upon confirmation of enrolment and following the University's official withdrawal date.
