

Phyllis Irene Grey Fellowships in Veterinary Science - Undergraduate

Fellowship Regulations

Focus

Female, Veterinary Science

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The Phyllis Irene Grey Fellowships in Veterinary Science support female undergraduate students with an interest in animal health research to study a Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree.

Background

These fellowships were established under the terms of the will of the Phyllis Irene Grey, who died in 1974.

Value and Tenure

The fellowships are offered annually and have a maximum value of \$1,000.

A lesser or greater amount may apply depending on the available income, a proportion may also be used to support the research of the recipient, this to be nominated at the time of the award.

The tenure is one year.

Typical Number on Offer

Fifteen fellowships are typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be female veterinary science students with a particular interest in animal health research.

Selection Criteria

Need as well as academic merit may be taken into consideration. Applicants should include in their application their curriculum vitae and any material establishing financial need as this will also inform selection.

Selection Panel

The fellowships are awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Veterinary Programme Management Committee.

Conditions of the Fellowship

If, for any reason, there are no applicants or applicants are deemed unsuitable the income will be accumulated and, according to the judgment of the University, either more fellowships or a fellowship of greater value will be offered later.

The fellowship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
