Purpose

The Les Batkin Scholarship financially supports students specialising in poultry husbandry.

Background

This scholarship was established from a donation by Les Batkin of Tuakau.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. In recent years this has been \$1,000.

The scholarship is usually awarded annually, and the tenure is for a single academic year. At the discretion of the University all, or part, of the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the scholarship may not be granted each and every year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship is typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- specialising in poultry husbandry.
- enrolled full time in a postgraduate degree or postgraduate diploma, or in the final year of an appropriate undergraduate degree programme at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on:

- academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship

The University Scholarships Committee may take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants in seeking an equitable distribution of funds.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The University Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and its decision is final.

Conditions of the Bursary

The Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee may withdraw or suspend the scholarship at any time if the recipient fails to make satisfactory progress.

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
