Focus

Veterinary Science.

Level of Study

Undergraduate – 4th Year.

Purpose

Background

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship will be up to a maximum of \$2,000.

The scholarship is tenable for one year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship will be awarded per year.

Eligibility

Applicants must

- be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- be studying full time in the 4th year of a Bachelor of Veterinary Science at Massey University.
- have at least a B grade average in the first three years of study for the degree.

Selection Criteria

The selection will be based on:

- academic merit.
- 1500-word essay.
- referees' reports.
- other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Royal Canin Selection Panel.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as these permit co-tenure.

In recommending the award of a scholarship the selection panel may take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicant with a view to achieving a reasonable distribution of available monies among qualifying candidates.

The Committee may decline to award any scholarships in any year if there are no applicants of sufficient merit to warrant an award.
