

The Massey University Pacific Scholarship for Foundation Studies

Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Pacific students.

Level of Study

Pre-degree, Foundation.

Purpose

This scholarship provides support for Pacific students enrolled in Massey University's Certificate in Foundation Studies or Certificate in University Preparation a pre-degree course designed to prepare students who do not meet academic entry requirements for undergraduate study.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is up to \$2,500 for full time students.

The tenure of the scholarship is for one year.

Payments will be made in two equal instalments following the official withdrawal date of the semester.

Typical Number on Offer

2 scholarships will be offered.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- a domestic student from Pacific heritage/ethnicity.
- enrolled full-time in the Certificate in Foundation Studies or Certificate in University Preparation.

Selection Criteria

Preference will be given to students who demonstrate:

- potential for academic excellence.

- participation and contribution to the Pacific community.
- good character.

The selection committee will be guided by principles of equity and diversity in the awarding of the scholarship to ensure equity of access to University education for all Pacific peoples regardless of gender, culture, ethnicity, disability, socioeconomic status or other diversities.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee in partnership with the Office of Pacific Success.

Conditions of the Scholarship

Recipients of the scholarship are expected to:

- participate with and contribute to the Pacific@Massey student community.
- consent to their information being shared on Pacific communication platforms for the purpose of profiling Pacific scholarship programme and sharing their stories.
- actively engage with the Scholars@Massey programme which supports scholars in their personal and scholarly development.

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as these permit co-tenure.
